This winter is off to a really slow start and I am sorry to report that not much has changed since our last update. In fact, it's possible that the trail conditions this week are actually a little worse than last. With a warm-up predicted for this weekend (with a possible wintry mix), things aren't looking so good.

Nevertheless, we are working hard to get the NorthWoods Trails in shape with brushing, new signs, maps and markers. And in Westmore, we are hoping to get the Willoughby State Forest Trails groomed next week.

We have done a little rolling of the trails in Westmore and, as of this morning, the conditions were actually quite nice. I was pleasantly surprised. Still, especially if you are looking for wide groomed skate lanes, you may be disappointed. There have been a number of mechanical issues with the WSF groomer and drag and we are working to get them resolved as quickly as possible so that we will be ready when some more white stuff hits.

So keep your fingers crossed for more snow and hopefully we will see you on the trails.

NorthWoods Trails Update

We noted last week that the [Leadership Trail is temporarily CLOSED](#) and that is still the case, we will be re-decking two critical bridges next week and look forward to opening up as soon as possible. Meanwhile, we are working to bring back the popular Echo Lake Loop--a 6 kilometer trail that crosses a diversity of environments on its way out towards Echo and back to NorthWoods. The Echo Loop will in all likelihood remain a backcountry trail this winter, with at least one notable exception and that is our intent to have it groomed for our Winter Open House coming up in February (February 13 to be exact).

Meanwhile, we have set up a new outdoor registration in our information kiosk where you will find ski and snowshoe information, maps, register box, program information, donation can, etc. Or if you arrive during business hours (8-4, M-F), you can talk to our staff to pick up a map, get some recommendations and make a donation.

Our snow report will continue throughout the winter months and will also be available (on a weekly basis) on our [website](#). Once we have a sufficient base, we expect to groom 2-3 times each week and will report on trail conditions accordingly.

Willoughby State Forest

As we mentioned last week, NorthWoods is partnering with Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation (VT FPR)to maintain and groom the Nordic ski trail system near Mt Hor. The Willoughby Trails are located off of the CCC Road in Westmore--just south of Lake Willoughby on Vermont Route 5A. There are large parking lots on either side of the road at the base of the CCC Road and an information kiosk where skiers and snowshoers can learn more.

Currently, the trails are un groomed but in good condition. Once both the groomer and drag are operating properly (and we have enough snow), we will get on a regular grooming schedule--probably 3 days a week. The trails feature roughly 12 kilometers of terrain for both classic and skate skiing. There are also some opportunities for backcountry skiing as well. Access is by donation and all funds support trail maintenance operations.

A note to walkers and dog owners: there has been much debate in the past about whether/not to allow dogs on the Willoughby ski trails due to the tendency to 'track up' and poop in the ski trails. NorthWoods welcomes dogs and walkers but asks that--per Westmore Town Ordinance--dogs be kept on a leash and owners dispose of any waste. In general, hikers, walkers, snowshoers and dogs should stay to one side of the trail to preserve the groomed ski trails. Thank you for cooperating and spreading the word!

Q Burke

Again, we wait.

NorthWoods is teaming up with Q Burke Mountain Resort to provide a variety of winter programs this year. Once the new Hotel is complete, NorthWoods will staff a recreation kiosk, offer ski and snowshoe rentals, and provide personal lessons and tours. We will use the Dashney Farm Trails (a short distance down the road) where Q Burke grooms roughly 12-15 kilometers of Nordic trail.

NorthWoods will provide daily 11am group Nordic Ski Lessons Thursday- Sunday as well as Snowshoe Ecology Tours Thursdays and Saturdays at 2pm. Friday evenings, NorthWoods will lead an evening Snowshoe Tour at 5pm.

Staff is on-hand to provide rentals, answer questions, distribute maps and lead guided programs (see our [website](#) for a complete list of winter activities). Trails are groomed twice weekly (generally Fridays and Mondays), weather permitting. Maps and information are available at the Lodge and at selected trail locations. Trail donations are collected on the honor system and help pay for grooming and trail maintenance expenses. For after hours and weekend use, check-in at our back entry.

Trail use: \$5/person/day (suggested donation)

Ski and Snowshoe Rentals: \$5/day

WILLOUGHBY STATE FOREST NORDIC TRAILS VT Route 5A, Westmore, Vt

Winter Details

NorthWoods is partnering with the Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation (VT FPR) to maintain and groom the winter ski trails in Willoughby State Forest. Access is available from the CCC Road parking lot on Vermont Route 5A in Westmore, just south of Lake Willoughby. Trails are open to the public seven days a week on a self-serve basis. Trail donations are collected on the honor system ad help pay for grooming and trail maintenance expenses. Donations can be made at the trailhead kiosk or sent to NorthWoods PO Box 220 East Charleston, VT 05833.

PLEASE NOTE: Trails are groomed for classic skiing (with set tracks) and skate skiing. All other uses, including snowshoeing, walking, crampons, etc. should avoid the groomed lanes and keep to one side. There is no ski patrol or afternoon sweep on the trails system and visitors use the trails at their own risk. Trails are groomed 2-3 days per week, weather permitting. Maps and information are available at the trailhead and at www.northwoodscenter.org.

DOGS: Dog can significantly impact the quality of groomed trails--particularly for skate skiing--by leaving weaving and wandering tracks. In addition, many visitors--particularly children--are not comfortable around dogs. Hikers and dog walkers are encouraged to use other trails in the Willoughby area. If you choose to use the groomed trails, **visitors MUST keep all dogs on a leash! Please clean up after your dog on the groomed trails and in the parking area.**
