Blue Skies, Full Moon

Its crisp and sunny out right now and the waxing moon will be rising in a clear sky tonight. These cold nights are helping our winter trails firm up and freeze over. This past week was really our first best opportunity to groom the trails at NorthWoods and at Mount Hor. And even though there was very little additional snow this week, the trail conditions continue to improve. I know there are quite a few people out there that wish we could receive the dumping of snow that will fall on Washington, DC this weekend.

Nevertheless, it looks like we may be able to salvage what's left of this winter and enjoy some descent skiing and snowshoeing. As you will see in the snow reports, we are gradually expanding our trail coverage and winter is not quite half over.

Be aware that you will still find wet spots and shallow cover wherever you go.

NorthWoods Trails Update

This week, we opened up the Leadership Loop and made a pass on Tripp Hill Connector and Above and Beyond. Both routes will improve with additional snow but are good to go. Again, beware of shallow hazards (rocks, stumps, wet areas). All local trails--Tamarack, Olympic and Echo Boulder--are groomed as well and, strung together, make for a nice tour. We will wait for some more snow before we open up Lower Clyde, Up and Away, and Gardner Path.

Meanwhile, all of our trails are open for snowshoeing and the woods trails, in particular, are looking great. It's a winter wonderland out there right now!

You will find an updated NorthWoods Trail Map on our website and at select junctions on our trail system. Weekend visitors can register in our outdoor information kiosk and we welcome your donations. Our snow report will continue throughout the winter months and will be archived on our winter programs page. You can also check in for daily updates. Once we have a sufficient base, we expect to groom 2-3 times each week and will report on trail conditions accordingly.

Willoughby State Forest

After a string of challenges at Willoughby, we completed our first full coverage of grooming this week. All trails are open and groom with the notable exception of the Connector Trail between CCC Road and Bartlett Mountain Road. Tracks are set and the Bartlett Mountain Loop is opened too!

There are 12 kilometers of terrain for both classic and skate skiing at Willoughby State Forest. Please find maps at our trailhead kiosk. Again, donations are welcome. All funds support trail maintenance operations.

A note to walkers and dog owners: there has been much debate in the past about whether/not to allow dogs on the Willoughby ski trails due to the tendency to 'track up' and poop in the ski trails. NorthWoods welcomes dogs and walkers but asks that--per Westmore Town Ordinance--dogs be kept on a leash and owners dispose of any waste. In general, hikers, walkers, snowshoers and dogs should stay to one side of the trail to preserve the groomed ski trails. Thank you for cooperating and spreading the word!

Still waiting...

NorthWoods is teaming up with Q Burke Mountain Resort to provide a variety of winter programs this year. Once the new Hotel is complete, NorthWoods will staff a recreation kiosk, offer ski and snowshoe rentals, and provide personal lessons and tours. We will use the Dashney Farm Trails (a short distance down the road) where Q Burke grooms roughly 12-15 kilometers of Nordic trail.

NorthWoods will provide daily 11am group Nordic Ski Lessons Thursday- Sunday as well as Snowshoe Ecology Tours Thursdays and Saturdays at 2pm. Friday evenings, NorthWoods will lead an evening Snowshoe Tour at 5pm.

We are open for skiing and snowshoeing during business hours, Monday-Friday, and offer a variety of terrain and trails. Staff is on-hand to provide rentals, answer questions, distribute maps and lead guided programs (see our website for a complete list of winter activities). Trails are groomed twice weekly (generally Fridays and Mondays), weather permitting. Maps and information are available at the Lodge and at selected trail locations. Trail donations are collected on the honor system and help pay for grooming and trail maintenance expenses. For after hours and weekend use, check-in at our back entry.

Trail use: \$5/person/day (suggested donation)

Ski and Snowshoe Rentals: \$5/day

Weekend and after hours Rentals are by appointment

WILLOUGHBY STATE FOREST NORDIC TRAILS VT Route 5A, Westmore, Vt

Winter Details

NorthWoods is partnering with the Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation (VT FPR) to maintain and groom the winter ski trails in Willoughby State Forest. Access is available from the CCC Road parking lot on Vermont Route 5A in Westmore, just south of Lake Willoughby. Trails are open to the public seven days a week on a self-serve basis. Trail donations are collected on the honor system ad help pay for grooming and trail maintenance expenses. Donations can be made at the trailhead kiosk or sent to NorthWoods PO Box 220 East Charleston, VT 05833.

PLEASE NOTE: Trails are groomed for classic skiing (with set tracks) and skate skiing. All other uses, including snowshoeing, walking, crampons, etc. should avoid the groomed lanes and keep to one side. There is no ski patrol or afternoon sweep on the trails system and visitors use the trails at their own risk. Trails are groomed 2-3 days per week, weather permitting. Maps and information are available at the trailhead and at www.northwoodscenter.org.

DOGS: Dog can significantly impact the quality of groomed trails--particularly for skate skiing--by leaving weaving and wandering tracks. In addition, many visitors--particularly children--are not comfortable around dogs. Hikers and dog walkers are encouraged to use other trails in the Willoughby area. If you choose to use the groomed trails, visitors MUST keep all dogs on a leash! Please clean up after your dog on the groomed trails and in the parking area.

A shuttle bus will run between the Hotel and Dashney Nordic Center where Q Burke will be grooming roughly 10 kilometers of Nordic terrain.
